

Assessment

Assessment is the way of certifying the achievement of the learning outcomes.

Learning outcomes are evaluated on:

- graded examinations;
- pass-fail assessments;
- defence.

The results of the assessment you receive are filed in SIS within 2 weeks after the assessment.

Exam is a knowledge check format, which is a differentiated assessment on a 6-grade scale where:

- A(5) – excellent 91 – 100%
- B(4) – very good 81 – 90%
- C(3) – good 71 – 80%
- D(2) – satisfactory 61 – 70%
- E(1) – sufficient 51 – 60%
- F(0) - incomplete <50%

A pass-fail assessment is a non-differentiated evaluation method of the knowledge check. It is indicated in the record as “pass” (P) or “fail” (F). You have passed when your result is at least 51%. Below 51%, means “fail”.

Your final grade may include different study tasks like

- tests;
- reports;
- essays;
- laboratory work;
- seminars etc.

Credit points

- The volume of a subject is given in credit points (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System, ECTS).
- One credit point equals 26 hours spent by a student on studies (both independent work and classroom studies).
- The proportions of classroom studies and independent work are determined in the course syllabus.
- You earn credit points only from a completed course if you get a positive result in the final assessment or defence.

Practical training is assessed by pass-fail assessment.
